

2. The Rise of the Antichrist

The 2nd Coming of Christ

The Second Coming of Christ is a challenging topic due to the many interpretations by biblical scholars of differing viewpoints. In this study, we will explore the Scriptures about the coming of Christ in the Books of Daniel and Revelation. I will also highlight and explain the significance of current events, as I believe they relate to the days leading up to the coming of Christ. As a disclaimer, I would like to state that I do not claim to have exclusive truth or that my interpretations are the only way to view this topic. The beliefs I share are conclusions from careful study of God's Word and various scholars' interpretations of this subject. At times the things that I will say will disagree with some of my favorite Bible teachers, and maybe yours too. I have the utmost respect for those teachers, but I am committed to teaching what we see in Scripture and not in extra-biblical literature. Many Bible teachers avoid the things we are studying because it can stir up heated debate. Let us agree to disagree agreeably! Be gracious in all things. After all, our interpretations can be wrong, but God's Word is never wrong.

This series aims to focus on the coming of Christ and prepare us for His appearance. The first-century believers often wrote about the coming of Jesus and encouraged one another to look forward to the day He comes. If that was such centuries ago, how much more should we live in our days? Now more than ever, it is crucial that we remember to lift our heads and say, "Come Lord Jesus!"

God Wants His Church to Know What He is Doing

I once heard someone say, "What on earth is going on?" For some reason, it took hold in my mind, and I thought it would be a great question to start with as we consider the events leading up to the coming of Christ. What on earth *is* going on? What is God doing in the days in which we live? How do events we see unfolding around us relate to what the Bible tells us will happen before Christ's return? What is *God* revealing or allowing so that He may bring His Kingdom into full view? When we see prophetic Scriptures being fulfilled, we can look for the signs of His return. He does not want us to be ignorant of His plans. Amos the prophet spoke about God's desire for you and me to know what He is doing on planet Earth in this way:

Surely the Sovereign LORD ***does nothing without revealing his plan*** to his servants the prophets (Amos 3:7. Emphasis mine).

Question 1) Why do you think God gave His revelation through dreams and images? Why doesn't He give us the facts precisely as they will occur with specific dates?

The Lord speaks to us for a reason. He does not waste words, yet He chose to speak in veiled terms in the language of the Prophets. Is there a reason God wanted to talk to us in dreams and visions instead of giving us precise factual details? Some of the things portrayed in the visions given to Daniel, Ezekiel, and John were not things familiar to their understanding. Therefore, they had to describe the pictures or visions as they saw or perceived them. Daniel, for instance, when he couldn't understand as much as he wanted, was told: "Go your way, Daniel, because the words are rolled up and sealed until the end. ¹⁰Many will be purified, made spotless and refined, but the

wicked will continue to be wicked. None of the wicked will understand, but those who are wise will understand” (Daniel 12:9-10). We live in a time where God is unsealing what Daniel wanted to look into more closely. There may be many reasons why God speaks in picture form and visions, but one of the reasons, I believe, is that God wants His people throughout the Church age always to be ready for His return. I trust that you, dear reader, are one of those wise and eager to be prepared and to understand the times in which we live.

A King’s Dream (Daniel 2)

Here is a hypothetical question for you to answer. Put yourself in this situation: If secret service men with dark glasses came into this room with sharpshooter rifles and loaded automatics aimed at our heads, and seconds later, the president of the United States walked in following them, would it be a bit of a surprise? What if the president told you, "I know that all of you are interested in prophecy; therefore, I demand that you interpret the dream I had last night. If you cannot interpret my dream, my secret service men will proceed to shoot every last one of you." After recovering from the shock of such a proposal, I imagine you may very nervously reply with something like this: "Please tell us your dream, and we will do our best." How would you then feel if he told you that he wasn't going to tell you the dream and demanded that you tell him what the dream and interpretation were? Would it put your heart in your mouth? Daniel, a prophet of God in the Bible, and three young men with him were placed in such a situation. The Bible tells us that when the king of Babylon commanded his wise men to tell him his dream and its meaning, they replied that what the king had asked of them was impossible. He then ordered them all to be put to death, which included Daniel and his three friends. When he was told of the edict, Daniel asked for time to seek God for the dream and interpretation, and the answer came to Daniel during the night. Daniel then went to king Nebuchadnezzar with the following words:

²⁷Daniel replied, "No wise man, enchanter, magician or diviner can explain to the king the mystery he has asked about, ²⁸but there is a God in heaven who reveals mysteries. He has shown King Nebuchadnezzar what will happen in days to come. Your dream and the visions that passed through your mind as you lay on your bed are these: ²⁹"As you were lying there, O king, your mind turned to things to come, and the revealer of mysteries showed you what is going to happen. ³⁰As for me, this mystery has been revealed to me, not because I have greater wisdom than other living men, but so that you, O king, may know the interpretation and that you may understand what went through your mind. ³¹"You looked, O king, and there before you stood a large statue—an enormous, dazzling statue, awesome in appearance. ³²The head of the statue was made of pure gold, its chest and arms of silver, its belly and thighs of bronze, ³³its legs of iron, its feet partly of iron and partly of baked clay. ³⁴While you were watching, a rock was cut out, but not by human hands. It struck the statue on its feet of iron and clay and smashed them. ³⁵Then the iron, the clay, the bronze, the silver and the gold were broken to pieces at the same time and became like chaff on a threshing floor in the summer. The wind swept them away without leaving a trace. But the rock that struck the statue became a huge mountain and filled the whole earth. ³⁶"This was the dream, and now we will interpret it to the king. ³⁷You, O king, are the king of kings. The God of heaven has given you dominion and power and might and glory; ³⁸in your hands he has placed mankind and the beasts of the field and the birds of the air. Wherever they live, he has made you ruler over them all. You are that head of gold. ³⁹"After

you, another kingdom will rise, inferior to yours. Next, a third kingdom, one of bronze, will rule over the whole earth. ⁴⁰Finally, there will be a fourth kingdom, strong as iron—for iron breaks and smashes everything—and as iron breaks things to pieces, so it will crush and break all the others. ⁴¹Just as you saw that the feet and toes were partly of baked clay and partly of iron, so this will be a divided kingdom; yet it will have some of the strength of iron in it, even as you saw iron mixed with clay. ⁴²As the toes were partly iron and partly clay, so this kingdom will be partly strong and partly brittle. ⁴³And just as you saw the iron mixed with baked clay, so the people will be a mixture and will not remain united, any more than iron mixes with clay. ⁴⁴***In the time of those kings***, the God of heaven will set up a kingdom that will never be destroyed, nor will it be left to another people. It will crush all those kingdoms and bring them to an end, but it will itself endure forever. ⁴⁵This is the meaning of the vision of the rock cut out of a mountain, but not by human hands—a rock that broke the iron, the bronze, the clay, the silver and the gold to pieces. "The great God has shown the king what will take place in the future. The dream is true and the interpretation is trustworthy" (Daniel 2:27-45).

I find it interesting that God would give this dream about what would happen in the future to a pagan King. God planned to elevate Daniel to high office by giving him the understanding of the future so that the Jewish people, having been dispersed from the land of Israel to Babylon, could be encouraged. There is coming a time when God will intervene in the affairs of men and set up His kingdom—a Rock (King Jesus) that will break the nations of this world into dust. God wants His people to know what on Earth is going on! He used the king of Babylon as an instrument to bring forth His Word.

The Interpretation of Nebuchadnezzar's Dream

In this prophecy, we see a timeline of more than 2,600 years covering four world kingdoms from the tip of the head of the image to the ten toes of the feet. Four kingdoms would come one after the other and occupy the land of Israel. The schedule started when Nebuchadnezzar received the dream in his second year on the throne (604 BC), and the timeline closes at the return of Christ. In the first kingdom, the head of gold represents king Nebuchadnezzar. Daniel said to the king, "*You are that head of gold, and after you, another kingdom will rise, inferior to yours. So, we see that the first, the head of gold, was King Nebuchadnezzar and the Babylonian Empire (Daniel 2:37).*" The second was the Medes and Persian Empire under Darius the Mede (Daniel 8:20). The Medes and Persians were allied together in destroying Babylon. The third was the Grecian Empire under Alexander the Great (Daniel 8:21), and the fourth was the Roman Empire, which succeeded the Grecian Empire. The first three kingdoms existed in Daniel's day (although the kings mentioned did not), but the empire of Rome was not yet in existence. We know from history that each empire succeeded the other. For the sake of time, we will concern ourselves just with the fourth kingdom, which in our timeline of the image, is where the Rock cut out of a mountain, the Kingdom of Jesus the Messiah, will come and break to pieces the world systems of Satan.

The kingdoms of this world have become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of His Christ; and He shall reign forever and ever (Revelation 11:15).

Some would say that this prophetic timeline has already been fulfilled because King Jesus came during the Roman occupation of Israel and set up His kingdom, the kingdom of God. They would quote Paul as saying, “For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking, but of righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit” (Romans 14:17). I agree with that statement to a certain extent, but it sure doesn’t seem to me, though, that the Rock has broken the iron, the bronze, the clay, the silver and the gold to pieces and scattered them to the wind without leaving a trace (verses 35 and 45). I believe that the Rock that smashes the kingdoms of this world is a picture of the Second Coming of Christ to put down all sin and rebellion. So what does the dream mean?

Although the Roman Empire became a dominant power after Greece, it has not been around for several centuries. Still, when one thinks about the last two thousand years, the Africans, the Indian Subcontinent, or even Asian nations haven’t dominated the world. The elites and money powers of the Roman Empire still dominate the world scene in the sense that the Roman Empire covered most of the countries of Europe. The legs of the vision perhaps symbolize that the Roman Empire was divided into two parts: the eastern Byzantine leg in Constantinople, present-day Istanbul, Turkey, and the western leg in Rome. The European people have been strong as iron and weak as clay (v. 42) over the last 1700 years, with several leaders trying to bring about a unified Europe, such as Charlemagne, Napoleon, and Hitler. France, at times, has been strong but also very weak. Germany has been strong but also very weak. We can say the same about England, Italy, and Spain too.

Many see the Treaty of Rome, signed on March 25, 1957, as the seedling that has grown into the European Union. This treaty introduced the European Economic Community and wasn't signed in London, Paris, Vienna, or Amsterdam but in Rome. In the days we live, we see a push by the elites of Europe and the USA (mainly composed of descendants of the Roman Empire) toward a one-world government. Many understand that the money powers of Europe are those that pull the strings of power through the private central bank set up in 1913 known as the Federal Reserve, which is as federal as Federal Express and is believed to hold no reserves, which is why they don't want an audit.

The clash with the Rock comes upon the feet of the statue (v. 34). Verse 44 says, “in the time of those kings,” God will set up His kingdom, which will never be destroyed. It is unclear from the passage what kings or leaders are mentioned, but ten kings are symbolized by the ten toes of the image, the last stage of the fourth kingdom. We will see this confirmed by the two following passages we are studying today in Daniel 7 and Revelation 13. These ten leaders of power blocs will be in power when the Antichrist comes on the scene.

A Little Horn Among Ten

Daniel receives his own dream in chapter seven, and in it, he sees four beasts that arise out of the sea. In Scripture, the sea is symbolic of a sea of people in unrest, “On the earth, nations will be in

anguish and perplexity at the **roaring and tossing of the sea**” (Luke 21:25). The four beasts refer to the same empires we have just read about in Daniel chapter 2. Daniel indicates that they are four kingdoms that will rise from the earth: “The four great beasts are four kingdoms that will rise from the earth” (Daniel 7:3, 17). Again, for the sake of time, we will focus our attention on the fourth kingdom:

7"After that, in my vision at night I looked, and there before me was a fourth beast—terrifying and frightening and **very powerful**. It had large iron teeth; it crushed and devoured its victims and trampled underfoot whatever was left. **It was different from all the former beasts**, and it had **ten horns**. 8"While I was thinking about the horns, there before me was **another horn, a little one**, which came up among them; and three of the first horns were uprooted before it. This horn had eyes like the eyes of a man and a mouth that spoke boastfully. 9"As I looked, "thrones were set in place, and the Ancient of Days took his seat. His clothing was as white as snow; the hair of his head was white like wool. His throne was flaming with fire, and its wheels were all ablaze. 10A river of fire was flowing, coming out from before him. Thousands upon thousands attended him; ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him. The court was seated, and the books were opened. 11"Then I continued to watch because of the boastful words the horn was speaking. I kept looking until the beast was slain, and its body destroyed and thrown into the blazing fire. 12(The other beasts had been stripped of their authority, but were allowed to live for a period of time.) 13"In my vision at night I looked, and there before me was one like a son of man, coming with the clouds of heaven. He approached the Ancient of Days and was led into his presence. 14He was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all peoples, nations and men of every language worshiped him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will never be destroyed. 15"I, Daniel, was troubled in spirit, and the visions that passed through my mind disturbed me. 16I approached one of those standing there and asked him the true meaning of all this. "So he told me and gave me the interpretation of these things: 17"The four great beasts are four kingdoms that will rise from the earth. 18But **the saints of the Most High will receive the kingdom and will possess it forever—yes, for ever and ever.** 19"Then I wanted to know the true meaning of the fourth beast, which **was different from all the others** and most terrifying, with its iron teeth and bronze claws—the beast that crushed and devoured its victims and trampled underfoot whatever was left. 20I also wanted to know about **the ten horns** on its head and about **the other horn that came up**, before which three of them fell—the horn that looked more imposing than the others and that had eyes and a mouth that spoke boastfully. 21**As I watched, this horn was waging war against the saints and defeating them,** 22until the Ancient of Days came and pronounced judgment in favor of the saints of the Most High, and the time came when they possessed the kingdom. 23"He gave me this explanation: "The fourth beast is a fourth kingdom that will appear on earth. It will be different from all the other kingdoms **and will devour the whole earth**, trampling it down and crushing it (Daniel 7:7-23).

Question 2) This little horn (v. 21) (the Antichrist) was waging war against the saints and defeating them. What do you perceive is happening here? Who are the saints, and what does defeat look like for them?

Let's think about this prophecy. The whole earth will come under the power of this fourth kingdom or the latter part of it (v. 23). I believe that we are in this particular phase of the plan of the evil one to conquer the whole earth and bring all nations under his control. The enemy seeks to bring unrest and chaos among nations with what they are pressing upon people, resulting in 10 power centers of several countries in a continent trading with one another—the North American Union being just one of those ten economic centers.

Let's continue with our reading in the seventh chapter of Daniel:

²⁴The ten horns are ten kings who will come from this kingdom. After them another king will arise, different from the earlier ones; he will subdue three kings. ²⁵He will speak against the Most High and oppress his saints and try to change the set times and the laws. The saints will be handed over to him for a time, times and half a time. ²⁶"But the court will sit, and his power will be taken away and completely destroyed forever. ²⁷Then the sovereignty, power and greatness of the kingdoms under the whole heaven will be handed over to the saints, the people of the Most High. His kingdom will be an everlasting kingdom, and all rulers will worship and obey him' (Daniel 7:24-27. Emphasis mine).

I do not think that the defeat in verse twenty-one refers to the persecution of Christianity. Persecution has never defeated Christianity; it has only stimulated the Church to grow deeper roots in God and numerically grow. Don't get me wrong, I believe that the Church worldwide will go through persecution, but the defeat the Scripture talks about refers to the Church losing the culture war. Many in the Church have just given up and refuse to stand up and fight against the evils that are going on in modern times. When the movie *Gone with the Wind* came out in 1939, and Clark Gable spoke his famous "d" word, it shocked the USA so much that it was front-page news. The culture of today has completely thrown away all godly morals. For the most part, the Church, called to be salt and light to the world (Matthew 5:13-16), has now gone into spiritual sleep mode, and it will get even worse when the Antichrist comes to power.

There is coming a time; Scripture tells us when many who have a form of godliness will fall away from the faith. Jesus said, "At that time many will turn away from the faith and will betray and hate each other" (Matthew 24:10). Paul the apostle also wrote about this event that will take place when many shall rebel against the faith of Christ: "Don't let anyone deceive you in any way, for that day will not come until the rebellion occurs and the man of lawlessness is revealed" (2 Thessalonians 2:3). We will explore in a later study what perhaps this prophesied event will be that will cause such a departure from the faith. This war against the saints will not overcome the true Church of Christ. True believers will stand for Christ even though they are being killed for their faith:

They overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony; they did not love their lives so much as to shrink from death (Revelation 12:11).

Question 3) When you think of the events of the last days leading up to the Second Coming of Christ, what is your greatest fear? How do you think Christ would answer your concern?

Whatever your fear is, you do not face it alone. Jesus said, “surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age” (Matthew 24:20).

When Nebuchadnezzar threw Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego into the fiery furnace, there was a fourth One in the fire with them (Daniel 3:25). When you go on a train journey, you get your ticket before you board the train. Don’t spend time worrying about it. God will give us the grace to help us just when we need it (Hebrews 4:16).

Those given the responsibility of teaching the Scriptures enjoy sharing the uplifting and encouraging passages of Scripture, but we must not shy away from the warnings; otherwise, we will be guilty of withholding truth essential for the Body of Christ. Verse twenty-five tells us of a period of three and one-half years; in other Scriptures, it’s called time, times, and half a time (Daniel 7:25; Daniel 12:7), which again refers to a period of three and a half years. Elsewhere it is called forty-two months (Revelation 13:5) and in another place, 1260 days (Revelation 11:2-3; Revelation 12:6). The Jewish people go by a monthly calendar of 30 days with a year totaling three hundred sixty days, so 1260 days brings us again to three and a half years. During that time, the Antichrist will rule dictatorially over the whole world, and for part of that time, he will persecute and oppress the saints. God will allow it, but only for the period He has designated. The saints will be delivered before God pours out His wrath on a sin-loving world. There are scriptural indications that the time of persecution will be cut short. Jesus said, “If those days had not been cut short, no one would survive, but for the sake of the elect those days will be shortened” (Matthew 24:22). But is this word, the *saints*, referring to Jews that become believers or to the Church? Some say the Church is taken up in the Rapture before the Antichrist comes to power and is not around for this persecution. We’ll look at the whole topic of the Rapture in another session, but for now, let’s look at specific passages in the book of Revelation, chapter 13, and see if we find similar images that we have already read in the Book of Daniel:

The Beast of the Book of Revelation

¹And I saw a beast coming out of the sea. He had ten horns and seven heads, with ten crowns on his horns, and on each head a blasphemous name. ²The beast I saw resembled a leopard, but had feet like those of a bear and a mouth like that of a lion. The dragon gave the beast his power and his throne and great authority. ³One of the heads of the beast seemed to have had a fatal wound, but the fatal wound had been healed. The whole world was astonished and followed the beast. ⁴Men worshiped the dragon because he had given authority to the beast, and they also worshiped the beast and asked, “Who is like the beast? Who can make war against him?” ⁵The beast was given a mouth to utter proud words and blasphemies and to exercise his authority for forty-two months. ⁶He opened his mouth to blaspheme God, and to slander his name and his dwelling place and those who live in heaven. He was given power to make war against the saints and to conquer them. And he was given authority over every tribe, people, language and nation. ⁸All inhabitants of the earth will worship the beast—all whose names have not been written in the book of life belonging to the Lamb that was slain from the creation of the world. ⁹He who has an ear, let him hear. ¹⁰If anyone is to go into captivity, into captivity he will go. If anyone is to be killed with the sword, with the sword he will be killed. This calls for patient endurance and faithfulness on the part of the saints (Revelation 13:1-10).

- 1) In this passage, we again see a 10-nation confederacy, symbolized by the ten horns as it was in Daniel 7:7, as well as the ten toes of the image in Daniel 2.
- 2) The Antichrist in verse two is described as having the same characteristics as the three former beasts in Daniel 7. In that passage, Babylon was like a lion (7:4). The Antichrist will have the ability to speak boastful things, such as Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon did when he boasted of how great Babylon was that he had built (Daniel 4:30-33). The second beast, which we know to be the empire of the Medes and Persians, is likened to a bear (7:5), which perhaps symbolizes the Antichrist's ferocity and power. The third beast, a leopard (7:6), is indicative of the speed of Alexander the Great, who conquered the Middle East and Western Asia in just over three years. In the same way, the Antichrist and his kingdom will be able to react with speed and power to world events, symbolized by the leopard (13:2).
- 3) He will be inspired and empowered by the dragon (Satan).
- 4) One of the heads of the beast will have what many believe to be a fatal blow healed (v. 3). It could be that one of the countries of his alliance has what will appear to be a deadly blow but is healed miraculously, but it could also be an assassination attempt on the Antichrist after which he is miraculously healed. If this interpretation is correct, it will undoubtedly increase his popularity and cause people to elevate him. This miraculous healing will enable him to present himself as one to be worshipped as a god.

He will oppose and will exalt himself over everything that is called God or is worshiped, so that he sets himself up in God's temple, proclaiming himself to be God (2 Thessalonians 2:4).

- 5) The whole world will be *astonished* (v. 3) and follow the beast. The Greek word *thoumazō* means to wonder and have in admiration and marvel. The emphasis certainly seems to be a time when *the whole world* (v. 7-8) will admire what this man will be able to accomplish through his ten-nation confederacy. Passages like this are why I believe this passage and associating passages are still future. Those who are Preterists (Preterists believe that this passage was fulfilled in the first century AD) have difficulty interpreting this passage at face value. Rome in the first century had no way of making the whole world astonished at any of the Caesars of Rome.
- 6) His ability to make war will far outstrip other nations, "who can make war against him?" (v. 4). His war machine, with all the technological advances in the 10-nation confederacy, will leave no one capable of standing against the beast. He will intimidate other nations into submission.
- 7) He will have charisma in how he talks (v. 5) and utter blasphemies and proud words. There will be an ability to sway people with convincing words; Adolf Hitler's ability to spellbind Germany has nothing on this man.
- 8) Here's the part that I don't like, he will be given the power to make war on the saints. Remember that this is what we also read in Daniel 7:25, along with the fact that the Antichrist's authority will be over the whole world for 3½ years (time, times, and half a time). We'll talk more about this great persecution in a later study.
- 9) He will call for everyone on planet earth to worship him, all whose names are not written in the book of life (v. 8). The Scripture seems to emphasize that this pertains to all inhabitants of the earth; verse 7 tells us that his authority will be over every tribe, people, language, and

nation. Those who have committed their lives to Christ will not go along with this proclamation, which may be why they will be persecuted, some going into captivity and others being put to death (v. 10).

Revelation 13:11 then talks about a second man who will arise that will be a religious figure; the Scriptures call him the False Prophet (Revelation 19:20). He will perform miraculous signs and force people to worship the first beast, the Antichrist. There are two things he does which will cause true believers (saints) to rebel against the authority of these two men:

¹⁵The second beast was given power to give breath to the image of the first beast, so that the image could speak and cause all who refused to worship the image to be killed. ¹⁶It also forced all people, great and small, rich and poor, free and slave, to receive a mark on their right hands or on their foreheads, ¹⁷so that they could not buy or sell unless they had the mark, which is the name of the beast or the number of its name. ¹⁸This calls for wisdom. Let the person who has insight calculate the number of the beast, for it is the number of a man. That number is 666 (Revelation 13:15-18).

- 1) He will set up an image of the Antichrist that speaks and demands worship, threatening death to those who refuse (Revelation 13:14-15). We are not told where this image is set up in this passage, but it perhaps ties in with Jesus' warning to the saints that **“when you see standing in the holy place the abomination that causes desolation, spoken of through the prophet Daniel—let the reader understand—then...there will be great distress”** (Matthew 24:15, also v.21). (The KJV uses the word *tribulation*, the NIV uses the phrase *distress*). 2 Thessalonians also mentions this same time, when Paul said that the Antichrist would **“exalt himself over everything that is called God or is worshiped, so that he sets himself up in God's temple, proclaiming himself to be God.”** (2Thessalonians 2:4).
- 2) He will force everyone to comply with his demands to take a mark signifying allegiance to their regime (Revelation 13:16-18). Let's talk about this Mark of the Beast:

The Mark of the Beast

How could it ever come about that nothing could be bought or sold without a mark? I certainly do not see a situation at any time in history where everyone, small and great, could not buy or sell without using cash, but in our day, with the use of credit cards and bank accounts with computers, we are in a time when buying and selling can be done entirely without cash. Think of everything you buy in the stores and find the RFID tag (Radio Frequency IDentification) on it. Some of you might have seen the little white boxes on music CDs or inside books at Barnes and Noble.

Did you know there is a plan in place by major corporations, mainly from America, Canada, and Europe, but going on all over the world, where everything bought and sold will have a microchip called an RFID tag on it? In 1999 Proctor and Gamble, along with Gillette and MIT, got together and looked into tagging all their products with these little computer chips that will record and track every bit of information from the production of the product to the home. Each tiny chip, some as small as the period at the end of a sentence on this page, is hooked up to a little antenna that picks up electromagnetic energy from a reader device. The reader device allows the item to be remotely identified as each chip has its unique number. The plan is now being put into the systems of

companies worldwide to track every item produced and where it ends up. With barcode technology, every can of Coke has the same UPC or barcode number (a can of Coke in Toronto has the same number as a can of Coke from Cincinnati), but in the next few years, with RFID technology, each can of Coke will have a unique ID number. All buying and selling will be digital, with each product linked to the person buying it when they scan a credit card or a frequent shopper card (i.e., a "registration system").

The second way it's different from a barcode is that these chips can be read from a distance, right through your clothes, wallet, backpack, or purse, without your knowledge or consent, by anybody with a suitable reader device. In a way, it gives strangers the ability to spy on you and identify you and the things you're wearing and carrying. Imagine walking through a doorway and having a hidden reader device identify the books in your briefcase and the brand of your underwear. Not only will everything have its own chip, but also plans are complete for every person to have a chip that can be read at the point of sale.

Both commercials above do not illustrate how money is transferred from the shopper to the grocery store, but it will be transferred at the point of sale by passing your hand over a reader device, and your bank details will be read and digital money transferred.

This idea sounds terrific to some because if a person is suspected of being a terrorist, his every move and everything he buys can be tracked. If a person does not have a chip embedded in his skin in the future, he will not be allowed to buy or sell. IBM has even developed the "person tracking unit" device that can zero in on your RFID-tagged products and use them to watch you like a hawk.¹ Katherine Albrecht and Liz McIntyre, two consumer rights activists, have written a book about this technology called *Spychips*. This book is not written with Christians in mind, but the possibilities and similarities of this mark are startling. Many people who don't read the Bible are already warning others of the loss of privacy and freedom at our doorsteps.

Many people, however, will view this technology as a good thing. For instance, reader devices are being placed on major roads that will track the tag in every car produced. Technology like this is already in use. Some major highways in Chicago, Miami, and other cities already have reader devices that take money out of your bank account when you go through a place on the toll road. For a certain amount of money, I can pay for the ability to see a map on the Internet, which will show me where the tracker unit on my son's cell phone is. He won't be able to hide his location. It will even tell me the speed his car is traveling. Many good reasons and advantages make this technology seem valuable and helpful. It may explain why people will welcome having a personal chip embedded in their skin, especially when people steal your identification data.

With terrorism being a significant concern, some will argue that having such a chip mandatory for everyone would be in the majority's best interest, claiming that it is for the safety or the common good of the people, making it worth the sacrifice of privacy and freedom. It is said that the Royal

family of England have chips embedded in their skin so that they can be easily found via satellite if they are kidnapped and held for ransom. Think of the advantages for the military. If one soldier was wounded and captured, satellites could see him immediately before being taken captive. If a US pilot were downed, his location could be seen on a map via a satellite-tracking unit. Think of the stores' advantages; security chips attached to products and items of clothing would not be able to be stolen; a remote reader device would be set off near an exit. Everything on planet Earth will be tracked via RFID. Nothing will be bought or sold except it has the stamp of ownership to Antichrist's world kingdom. Taking the Mark of the Beast will equal selling your soul to the Antichrist. There will be a commitment along with the Mark to worship Antichrist's image:

"If anyone worships the beast and his image and receives his mark on the forehead or on the hand, ¹⁰he, too, will drink of the wine of God's fury, which has been poured full strength into the cup of his wrath. He will be tormented with burning sulfur in the presence of the holy angels and of the Lamb (Revelation 14:9-10).
